
Motorists honk for impeachment

WASHINGTON — While President Nixon and his family were secluded at Camp David, about 1000 demonstrators paraded in front of the White House yesterday carrying signs reading: "Honk if you want him impeached." Passing motorists responded with their car horns and local police stopped a number of them and issued \$5 tickets for 'unnecessary noise.'

The pickets marched along both sides of Pennsylvania Avenue after a lunch-time rally on the Ellipse, the circular park south of the White House, where they cheered journalist I. F.

Stone's charge that Nixon was guilty of a "crafty and cunning" obstruction of justice in firing Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox a week ago.

"If the President wants to prove his innocence, he has no easier way than to restore Cox, to give him a free hand to get the documents and to prove that he had no part" in the Watergate scandal, said Stone.

The carnival-like rally, sponsored by the three-month-old Committee to Impeach the President and the Washington - area Impeachment Coalition, drew a mostly youthful crowd.
