**President's Secluded
Weekend at Camp David**

Camp David, Md.

President Nixon spent a secluded weekend at his Camp David mountaintop retreat.

Deputy Press Secretary Gerald L. Warren said the President spent some time working in his Aspen Lodge study yesterday, discussing the Middle East situation by telephone with Secretary of State Henry Kissinger.

He said Mr. Nixon also was in touch by telephone with chief of staff Alexander M. Haig Jr.; his legislative aide, William Timmons, and Press Secretary Ronald L. Ziegler.

Members of the President's family were with him over the weekend. Warren said they joined the Presi-

dent in reading a batch of 200 telegrams that the White House delivered, showing "overwhelmingly" favorable response to Mr. Nixon's Friday night news conference.

The President also watched the Washington Redskins-New Orleans Saints football game on television.

The entire Nixon family, including son-in-laws David Eisenhower and Edward Cox were together Friday night and most of Saturday.
