A majority of Americans (55 per cent) think President Nixon should not be impeached and compelled to leave the presidency, as determined by a special nationwide survey conducted immediately fol-

lowing Mr. Nixon's press conference Friday evening.

An even larger majority, 62 per cent, express the opinion that it would not be in the best interests of the country for Nixon to resign at this time.

Confidence in the Nixon adminstration, however, remains at a low level. A majority in the survey (55 per cent) say they have either "not very much" or "no" trust and confidence in the administration. This finding represents little change from the one recorded in a mid-October survey in which the same question was asked.

Of the six in ten persons who say they have seen or heard the President's press conference, 53 per cent found his responses concerning Watergate to be unconvincing. This compares with 31 per cent who found them convincing and 16 per cent who have mixed feelings or do not express an opinion.

Another question s hows six in ten persons (63 per cent) saying they would like to see Congress confirm Representative Gerald Ford as vice president at this time. This compares with 17 per cent who are opposed to confirmation and 20 per cent who do not express an opinion. Following are the questions and national findings:

"Some people think it would be in the best interests of the country for President Nixon to resign at this time. What is your opinion?" Yes in best interest

"How much trust and confidence do you have in the Nixon administration: a great deal, a fair amount, not very much, or none at all?"
