In Probe of '72 Contribution

Washington

The Senate Watergate committee yesterday obtained court orders protecting eight corporate executives from prosecution in exchange for testimony presumably about a \$25,000 contribution to President Nixon's 1972 campaign.

The executives — all associated with the American Shipbuilding Co. of Cleveland, are expected to be on the witness list when the committee resumes its public hearings tomorrow, concentrating on campaign fi-

nances.

Chief U.S. District Judge John J. Sirica signed immunity orders for the eight men after committee lawyers told him they anticipated the executives would otherwise plead a Fifth Amendment protection against self-incrimination.
