L'Executives Get Immunity In Campaign Funding Inquiry

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29 (UPI)—The Senate Watergate Committee obtained court orders today protecting eight corporate executives from prosecution in exchange for testimony, presumably about an alledged \$25,000 contribution to President Nixon's re-election campaign last year.

The executives, all associated with the American Shipbuilding Company of Cleveland, are expected to be on the witness list when the committee resumes its public hearings this Wednesday, concentrating on campaign funding.

Chief Judge John J. Sirica of the Federal District Court here signed immunity orders for the eight men after committee lawyers told him they thought that the executives would otherwise invoke their Fifth Amendment privilege against self-incrimination.

The orders will protect them against prosecution for any-
