

David Blames The Media

Washington

Echoing White House complaints, David Eisenhower yesterday accused the news media, especially television networks, of unfair reporting of President Nixon's Watergate troubles.

The President's son-in-law said in a television interview that there had been too much reporting "without applying any perspective to it at all."

He also said news leaks "timed to either save people facing prosecution or to try to make them attractive as an immunity witness . . . or leaks designed to destroy the public figures has been an incredible spectacle."

Eisenhower, 25, was interviewed on NBC's Today show.
