

In answer to the first question at his press conference on October 26, the President promised, in regard to his proposed appointment of a new special prosecutor, that "We will cooperate with him. And I do not anticipate that we will come to the time when he would consider it necessary to take the President to court. I think our cooperation will be adequate." But in answering the second question, Nixon stated "we will not provide presidential documents to a special prosecutor."

I can only presume from this that the President's choice as special prosecutor will know from the beginning that he is not expected to take his job seriously and that should he operate under the misapprehension that he is to actively seek the truth, he will be disposed of, as was Mr. Cox.

Obviously the President has in mind a presidential whitewash. I hope that the American people and the American Congress will not be misled by this man any longer and will take appropriate action to remove him from office.
