Tower Orges Full Pursuit Of 'Trail' of Watergate

Senator John G. Towers,
Republican of Texas, a supporter of President Nixon's
policies, said Tuesday night that
the Watergate "trail" should
be followed "wherever it leads
—even into the Oval Office,"
The Associated Press reported.
Senator Tower said the renewed Watergate prosecution
should be headed by someone
whose "objectivity" was above
reproach and who would not
enter the investigation "with
the cards stacked against" the
President.
