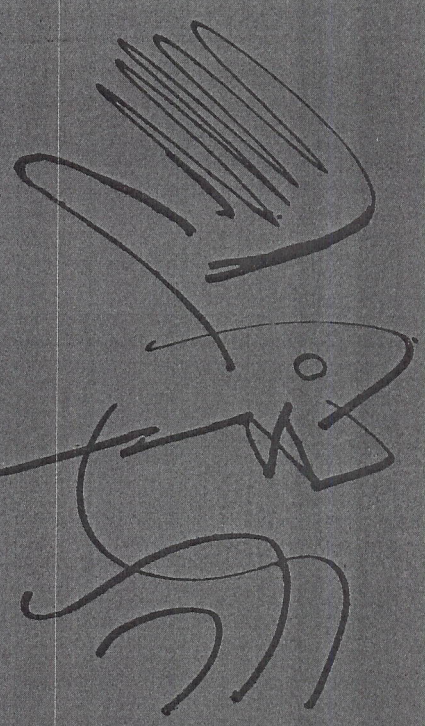

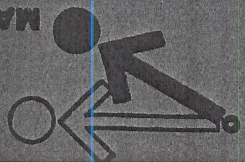

A NEW URGENCY

At the time this conference was planned and prepared, President Richard Milhous Nixon had not yet overreached himself by defying the courts and ordering Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox to cease his search for the truth. Nor had he been forced to accept U.S. Attorney General Elliot Richardson's resignation for refusing to fire Cox or felt compelled to fire Deputy Attorney General William French Smith for likewise refusing to do the firing. Congress had not yet been challenged.

Washington is far from Marin County. But the future of the American people and their government is going to be shaped by the grassroots concern on the local level. In this light, your active participation in the conference assumes even greater significance.
