Clare Boothe Luce, widow of the co-founder of Time magazine, says the magazine's editors were "making a very, very grave mistake" in calling editorially for President Nixon to resign.

In an interview Monday on National Public Radio, the widow of Henry R. Luce said the editors of Time and other publications urging a presidential resignation were "trying to bypass the constitution, subvert the political process and grossly abuse the power of the press."

The weekly news magazine urged Mr. Nixon's resignation this week in its first editorial since it began publication 50 years ago.

Time said Mr. Nixon and the nation had passed "a tragic point of no return."
