WASHINGTON, Nov. 5 (AP) — Senator William B. Saxbe, the Attorney General-designate, denied Monday having advo-cated destruction of the White House Watergate tapes if they proved to be incriminating. The Republican from Ohio was quoted by The Hong Kong Standard on Aug. 23 as having said during a speech to the local chapter of the American Chamber of Com-merce:

"I think the President is right "I think the President is right on standing on his rights not to release the tapes. I per-sonally wish I had never heard of the tapes. If they're in-criminating, they should be destroyed, and I'm sure they will; but I think he's right in saying that a President cannot be horsed around in the courts." Senator Saxbe, nom-inated last week by President Nixon to head the Justice De-partment, issued this statement Monday: "If the question is, was I

partment, issued this statement Monday: "If the question is, was I advocating any illegal activity in the Hong Kong speech, the answer obviously is no. In response to a question after the Hong Kong speech, I in-dicated that if there was illegal activity recorded on the tapes, I questioned whether such tapes would ever be forth-coming." He also said that he re-recalled indicating that be-cause Mr. Nixon and others had known recording devices were installed in Presidential offices, "I considered it highly unlikely that anything embar-rassing would have been said under those circumstances." Earlier, a spokesman for Mr. Saxbe had said the Senator did not recall making the statement attributed by the Hong Kong newspaper.
