Time Rapped By Mrs. Luce For Editorial

HONOLULU, Nov. 7 (AP) —Clare Boothe Luce, widow of Time magazine cofounder Henry R. Luce, has criticized the editors of the magazine for editorially calling for President Nixon's resignation.

"I think they are making a great mistake because it bypasses the Constitution and seeks to rob the people of their prerogative," Mrs. Luce said in an interview.

"The Constitution provides ways for getting rid of a President. He can be thrown out of office by election or by impeachment."

Mrs. Luce said the editors of Time did not consult with her about the editorial, the first since the magazine began publication 50 years ago. "They never do consult with shareholders about what they print, and I wouldn't expect them to," she said.

Mrs. Luce is a shareholder of the magazine but holds no other position with Time.
