David Gelber, WBAI, commenting on the reaction of businessmen to the complex of Watergate scandals:

With businessmen increasingly plagued by their close association with an administration which has become a national scandal, the sheer embarrassment may force more and more business to speak out for resignation. But there's also a feeling among establishmentarians that the damage has already been done.

Attorney General designate Saxbe, in a bittersweet moment in early September, told the Wall Street Journal, "I get the feeling sometimes that this administration could be the last chance for businessmen to run the country and they've struck out. It's a damned shame. I'm afraid that as a result of booting [?] this chance we'll go back to the misery lobby and the social planners."
