Cox Reported Going Back to Harvard Post

BOSTON, Nov. 8—Harvard University President Derek Bok has disclosed that former Watergate Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox will return to the university in January as Williston Professor of Law.

Bok told a student dinner at Harvard Wednesday night that Cox was in Cambridge Wednesday on his way to vacation in Maine. Bok said, "Cox was feeling very sad about his dismissal,"

missal," Cox, a Harvard graduate of 1934, was Royall Professor of Law at Harvard from 1958 to 1961 when he became U.S. solicitor general. He served under Presidents Kennedy and Johnson in that office until 1965 when he went back to Harvard as Williston Professor of Law. He left in May to become Watergate special prosecutor.
