Ford Says Nixon Will Never Resign

New York

Vice President designate Gerald Ford said yesterday there is "no possibility" President Nixon will resign or "be swayed by the mob" or newspaper editorials calling for his impeachment.

"The President has reaffirmed that his policy was one of full and frank disclosure and full cooperation with the court, Ford said.

"I believe this action by the President of full and frank disclosure will go a long way toward rebuilding public confidence . . ."

Ford made the comments after an address to the Calvin Bullock Forum, a busi-

nessmen's educational series.

"I'm convinced there is no possibility of the President's resigning," he said, adding:

"I don't think the President is going to be swayed by the mob or the editorials."

Ford said that the disclosure in Washington yesterday that a dictaphone tape recording purported to be Mr. Nixon's recollections of a conversation with John W. Dean III is now missing is relatively unimportant.

Ford said that a tape made the following day, April 16, of a telephone conversation between Dean and the President contains a rehash of the Nixon-Dean talk.
