Vice Presidential Nomi-nee Gerald R. Ford said yesterday letters and telegrams urging congress to impeach President Nixon are the result of "pressure groups that have always groups that have always been opposed to the Nixon administration . . ." The house republican leader urged citizens who support the President to write their congressmen and senators. "If you really believe that in you reany believe that impeachment or resignation is the only answer, by all means say so," Ford said in a speech before the National

Association of Realtors Convention.

"But if you are part of that much larger group that believes in fair play and in the importantt hings that Ri-chard Nixon had done and can do for America, don't wait for someone else to do it for you." Ford said the deluge of

letters and telegrams demanding impeachment or resignation were from traditional Nixon foes who had always opposed the adminis-

tration's policies. "Meanwhile," he said, "the famous 'silent majori-ty' has been living up to its name" and "I hope that each of you, will take the time to express your person. time to express your personal views to your senators and congressmen."
