SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Nov. 14 (UPI)—John B. Connally urged Americans today to be patient and wait until all the facts about the Water-gate affair are known before

the facts about the Watergate affair are known before trying to get rid of President Nixon.

"We're seeing a great period of political stress unequaled certainly in our lifetime and perhaps in the history of the Republic, and everyone trends to panic about it," Mr. Connally told 3,000 delegates attending a convention of the Southern Medical Association.

The former three-term Democratic Governor of Texas and Secretary of the Treasury, who became a Republican earlier this year, told reporters he did not know on what grounds anyone seriously talks about efforts to impeach the President.

"This is a very drastic step for the nation to take," he said. "It seems to me the charges have to be very clear and unequivocal, and I don't know onw hat basis charges would be brought."
