

Gude Unhappy After Nixon Talk

Rep. Gilbert Gude (R-Md.), one of about 100 Republican congressmen who met the President for breakfast yesterday to hear President Nixon's explanations of the Watergate affair and other administration difficulties, said he left unsatisfied.

"It was as convincing as any of the affair has been," Gude said.

The meeting was cordial, but the firing of independent prosecutor Archibald Cox was not discussed, Gude said, and the President left unanswered the question of why there should not be a special prosecutor accountable to Congress or the courts.

"When we started talking about the need to visit and communicate more with Congress, there was not much receptivity," Gude said. "I don't think the breakfast by itself, materially altered anything."
