It was the first time the FBI

It was the first time the FBI had been connected in any way with the money, which Rebozo eventually returned intact earlier this year. At his Oct. 26 news confer-ence, Mr. Nixon characterized Rebozo as "a totally honest man" and said he acted prop-erly in holding and then re-turning the contribution.

erly in holding and then re-turning the contribution. Reps. Charles W. Whalen Jr. (R-Ohio) and Matthew J. Ri-naldo (R-N.J.) reported Mr. Nixon's remarks of FBI in-volvement during his final breakfast meeting with GOP congressmen about the Water-gate scandal vesterday.

Whalen said Mr. Nixon told the group that Rebozo had ac-cepted the money from a Hughes representative on the premise that it would be given to the finance chairman when-ever appointed, but later de-cided to return it when an in-ternal dispute erupted in Hughes' financial empire. "He (Mr. Nixon) said Rebozo returned it in the presence of

"He (Mr. Nixon) said Rebozo returned it in the presence of an FBI man who checked it out—fingerprinted and checked the serial numbers," Whalen said.

Whalen said. Whalen quoted the Presi-dent as saying the FBI checked the serial numbers to see if the bills corresponded to the same serial numbers on the monet Rehard received

the money Rebozo received. Rinaldo gave a similar ac-count of Mr. Nixon's comment, which was made in answer to a question from one of the congressmen.
