## NIXON CRITICIZED BY MRS. MITCHELL

He 'Knew Everything' About Watergate, She Contends

WASHINGTON, WASHINGTON, Nov. 20 (UPI)—Mrs. John N. Mitchell said today that President Nixon had discussed every move of his re-election campaign with Mr. Mitchell, who was his campaign manager. The President "knew everything that was going on" before and after the Watergate burglary, she asserted. Nov.

Mrs. Martha Mitchell said in an interview that Mr. Mitchell, the former Attorney General, had told her he discussed the campaign with Mr. Nixon during trips aboard the Presidential yacht Sequoia.

"The President and John

and John would go out and discuss everything that was happening. It was all carried out on orders from the White House," she said.

She added: "Under no circumstances could the President not have known what was going on because he was talking to John Mitchell all the time. He was aware. He knew everything that was going on in Watergate."

## 'Green Book'

"The whole campaign was planned by the White House. They had this green campaign book and everything they were going to do was in it. It had in it the most secretive operations ever conducted in an election in the United States.

"The President and every-

election in the United States.

"The President and everybody else said it was a foolproof espionage system against the Democrats."

She said her husband told her during the campaign that Mr. Nixon "knows everything that goes on," including her whereabouts during the day.

She predicted Mr. Nixon "will be out of the White House by April."

"He's had the worst Administration in the history of our

He's had the worst Administration in the history of our country. He has let so many people go down the drain for him. All he has tried to do is save himself."

She said she did not want to talk about her separation from her husband, who left their Fifth Avenue apartment in New York in September, but she indicated that he was living in a New York hotel under an assumed name.
