

Andreas Pleads Innocent

Minneapolis

Dwayne O. Andreas, millionaire Minneapolis businessman, pleaded innocent yesterday to charges of making an illegal \$100,000 campaign contribution to Senator Hubert H. Humphrey's 1968 presidential campaign.

Andreas had been charged with using a total of \$100,000 in funds from the First Interoceanic Corp. for four separate contributions to Humphrey for President organizations in Illinois.

Joseph Walters, Minneapolis attorney, represented both Andreas and the corporation in court. Andreas, chairman of the board of Interoceanic Corp., did not appear. He is reportedly in Europe.

U.S. District Judge Earl Larsen ordered Andreas to post \$1000 personal bond when he returns to Minneapolis and attorneys were given until December 21 to file motions.

Four counts each were filed against Andreas and the corporation. The information read at the hearing charged that four contributions of \$25,000 were given the Minneapolis Democrat's campaign organization in violation of laws governing corporate contributions.
