## NOV 2 7 1973 PROSECUTOR CHECKS UNION GIFT TO NIXON

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25 (UPI)

—Investigators for the special Watergate prosecutor, Leon Jaworski, are looking into a \$100,000 gift from the Seafarers' International Union of North America to President Nixon's re-election committee, Time magazine reported Sunday.

The magazine's report came the same day the union announced that Mr. Nixon would address its convention tomorrow as part of his public Watergate counteroffensive.

The Time report said that on the same day the \$100,000 from the seafarers went to the Committee for the Re-Election of the President, the union borrowed \$100,000 from the Chemical Bank of New York. It did not give a source for its information.

It said that "no loan should have been necessary if the money had come from voluntary contributions by members as required by law."

"Moreover, the Nixon committee waited three months to report the union's contribution, though the law clearly states that donations must be reported within 48 hours of receipt," Time said.
