Nixon to Issue Finance 'Series'

President Nixon will release "in series form complete information" that will clean up "all questions ... and misconceptions" about his personal finances, the White House said yesterday.

Deputy White House press secretary Gerald L. Warren said the possibility existed the imformation could be released this week, but would

not amplify on his state-ment that it will come in series form.

He said information on Mr. Nixon's tax matters and Watergate-related issues such as the ITT antitrust settlement case and the so-called milk fund will be provided to congressmen and the nation's governors. In other actions:

• President Nixon signed a bill providing \$4.4 billion for activities of the Departments of State, Justice, Commerce and several other government agencies.

The President announced he will nominate James W. Plummer, 53, a vice president of the Lockheed Aircraft Corp. in California to be under secretary of the air force. He will succeed John L. McLucas, who was elevated to the post of Secretary of the Air Force in July.
