## Butz Sees Watergate Historic 'Footnote'

CHICAGO, Nov. 28 (AP)—
News about Watergate-scandal developments and other "headlines of bad . . . will be less than a paragraph—a mere footnote in the page. mere footnote — in the pages of history," Agriculture Secretary Earl L. Butz said today.

Butz, in a speech on "Who will write the history of Good?" prepared for the National 4-H Congress, mentioned Watergate specifically only once in the 10-page address calling for more public emphasis on positive achieveemphasis on positive achievements of the American economic and political system and the Nixon administration.

He stressed that "the contemporary history of bad" traditionally obscures and is better articulated than "the substantive history of good which is not transitory."
