

To Testify at LSD Trial

SAN DIEGO, Nov. 28 (AP) — Richard G. Kleindienst has been ordered by a Federal judge to testify in the trial of seven persons accused of smuggling eight ounces of LSD into San Diego County.

United States District Court Judge Gordon Thompson Jr., overruling prosecution objections yesterday, ordered the former Attorney General to appear as a defense witness tomorrow and produce records of his whereabouts for the period Jan. 1-12 of this year.

Mr. Kleindienst's testimony is being sought because an authorization for a wiretap on one of the defendants carries Mr. Kleindienst's signature.

Defense attorneys said they would question Mr. Kleindienst in an effort to show he had not read the documents supporting the wiretap request and did not actually sign the authorization.
