Bill Signed to Extend Watergate Grand Jury

one mandatory six-month ex-tension of the grand jury's tenure and for an additional six-month extension at the dis-cretion of the U.S. District Court. The bill provides that "in no event" will the term of the grand jury be extended beyond Dec. 4, 1974.

President Nixon signed a bill yesterday to extend for as much as a year, if necessary, the life of the Watergate grand jury.

The grand jury had been scheduled to go out of business on Dec. 4—next week. The extension was requested by the Department of Justice last month.
