The <u>Times</u> made a heroine of Communist Angela Davis ... for **POWER AND** PROFIT ... and a hero of Daniel Ells-berg from whom it "acquired" (through cir-cuitous, clandestine trysts) the stolen Penta-gon Papers—all for POWER AND PROFIT. TIME SETS THE CLOCK BACK
