

Friend Helps Krogh Meet Legal Costs

DANVILLE, Ill., Dec. 5 (UPI)—A businessman and childhood friend of Egil (Bud) Krogh, former head of the White House "plumbers," said Tuesday he has raised \$30,000 to help pay Krogh's legal fees.

Krogh pleaded guilty in Washington last week to charges of infringement of the civil rights of Dr. Lewis Fielding, Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist, in a 1971 break-in at Fielding's office. State charges of burglary and conspiracy against Krogh were dismissed.

James Morand, 35, a Danville hardware manufacturer, said Krogh incurred about \$60,000 to \$70,000 in legal expenses before he entered the guilty plea.

Morand, who met Krogh when the two were children in Lake Oswego, Ore., said he had received \$30,000 in donations from "people that knew Bud, schoolmates and an awful lot of lawyers that sent in funds and didn't even know him."
