

That He Will Resign Soon

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4 (UPI) —Bryce N. Harlow confirmed today consistent reports that he would soon leave his post as a Presidential adviser.

He said no date had been set for his departure but that it would be "relatively soon." Mr. Harlow, 57 years old, who served for eight years as a deputy assistant to President Eisenhower, said he was not leaving out of dissatisfaction with the Nixon Administration. "I had a complete understanding with the President when I came back that it was on a temporary basis," he said, noting it had been six months since he was recalled to government service from his job as a vice president of Proctor & Gamble.
