## SFChronicle Wallace 'Tax Break' **For Donated Papers**

Montgomery, Ala. Governor George Wallace received a personal income tax deduction by donating his 1968 presidential campaign papers to the state, the Montgomery Advertiser reports.

The newspaper said yesterday that Wallace made his deduction of about \$30,-000 under the same law President Nixon used in claiming deduction for some of his papers.

The director of state archives, Milo Howard, con-

firmed that the Alabama Department of Archives and History has the Wallace papers but declined to say what value was put on them.

"That's a personal matter between the governor and the archives," Howard said. The director also refused to show the papers.

"It was a restricted gift and can be seen only with permission from Governor Wallace or the executor of his estate for the next 25 years," Howard said.
