**F.B.I. AGENT SHOOTS
AIDE ON WATERGATE**

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 7 (AP)—A Federal Bureau of Investigation agent was slashed at a Federal building entrance here, then wounded his assailant and accidentally shot a Senate Watergate Committee investigator.

A noontime crowd saw the violence yesterday.

Hospitalized for treatment were the F.B.I. agent, Tom Hopkins, who was cut on the neck, and Carl Rizer, 57 years old, a Senate Commerce Committee investigator on loan to the Watergate committee. He was wounded in the right leg.

The police said that George Session, 18, of San Francisco,

was treated for a deep grazing wound across his chest and arm.

Mr. Session was arraigned before United States Magistrate Richard Goldsmith on charges of assault of a Federal agent and assault with intent to commit murder. The charges carry maximum sentences of 10 and 20 years, respectively. He was held in lieu of \$50,000 bail.

United States Attorney James L. Browning Jr. said that Mr. Hopkins and Mr. Session had accidentally brushed each other and that Mr. Session had produced a razor-type instrument used to open boxes. Mr. Hopkins pulled his gun, ordered Mr. Session to freeze and Mr. Session attacked, according to Mr. Browning. Mr. Hopkins then fired once and the bullet grazed Mr. Session and hit Mr. Rizer, the attorney said.
