

Ford Names Members of His Staff

Washington

Vice President Gerald R. Ford yesterday announced major appointments to his staff, including some former House aides and some holdovers from Spiro T. Agnew's staff.

Ford named Robert T. Hartmann, 56, his legislative assistant throughout the Nixon administration, as chief-of-staff to the vice president.

Before going to work in the House, Hartmann served 25 years as a reporter and was Washington bureau chief for the Los Angeles Times.

One holdover from Agnew is Major General John M. Dunn, Agnew's military aide, who was named assistant for administration and senior military aide.

The other holdover is Walter L. Mote, who continues as assistant to the president of the Senate.

Other former House aides who will remain with Ford are Mildred Leonard, his executive secretary for 22 years, who will serve as personal assistant; Paul A. Mitich, press secretary, and Dorothy Hessler, personal secretary.

Other appointments include Kenneth E. Belieu, former undersecretary of the Army, consultant for legislative affairs; William Casselman II, resigning as general counsel for the General Services Administration, legal counsel; W. Dewey Clower, deputy assistant Commander Howard J. Kerr and Mariamm Lieutenant Colonel America Lardo, military aides.
