Rebozo's Adviser On Hughes Money

One of President Nixon's chief advisers in preparing the recent statement of his personal finances also acted as a key intermediary in the return of \$100,000 in cash from Florida banker Charles G. Rebozo to a lawyer for Howard R. Hughes, it was disclosed yesterday.

Kenneth W. Gemmill, a Philadelphia tax lawyer who worked without pay for a month at the White House on last weekend's voluminous report of Mr. Nixon's financial dealings, confirmed yesterday that he had advised Rebozo last spring to return the cash and make a voluntary disclosure on the matter to the Internal Revenue Service.

Gemmill was identified in secret testimony before the Senate Watergate committee earlier this month as having first informed Hughes lawyer Chester Davis that Rebozo wished to return the funds to Hughes.
