United Press International "That will never happen," President Nixon said yester-day when a long-time Re-publican politician asked if he planned to resign. The President's statement was relayed to reporters by former State Sen. M. Har-vey Taylor, 97, of Harris-burg, Pa., who called on Mr. Nixon in the Oval Office to express support.

Jesus Christ." Taylor likened the Presi-dent's plight to that of an adultress who was stoned by a mob until Christ waved his hand and said "Let he who is without sin cast the first stone."
