Ervin Says Justice Agency

Should Be Independent Unit

(AP)—Senator Sam J. Ervin Jr. introduced a bill today to make the Justice Department an independent branch of the Government

the Justice Department an independent branch of the Government.

The North Carolina Democrat, who heads both the Senate Watergate committee, and
the Judiciary Committee's Subcommittee on Separation of
Powers, said the latter group
would hold hearings on the
legislation next year.

"Watergate and other events
over the past months have
called into question the function of the Department of Justice, and have brought forth
allegations that the Department
of Justice has been used for
political purposes by the White
House," Mr. Ervin said in a
statement.

Under the Ervin bill the Attorney General would be appointed by the President for a
six-year term but would not be
a member of the Cabinet.
