

Hughes' Gifts Went

Astray, Lawyer Says

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 15 (UPI)—Thousands of dollars given by Howard R. Hughes to a go-between for delivery to political candidates, including Hubert H. Humphrey, never reached the intended recipients, a lawyer for Hughes claimed in a court brief filed Friday.

The amount actually delivered by Robert Maheu, former head of Hughes' Nevada empire, was \$89,800 short of the amount he was entrusted with, Howard Jaffe said.

Jaffe's brief was filed as part of a complex legal battle between Hughes and Maheu, who was fired by Hughes.

Jaffe said that Maheu had been given \$475,000 to distrib-

ute to politicians, but that only \$385,200 reached the candidates.

Humphrey never received \$50,000 of Hughes money that Maheu was supposed to deliver, Jaffe said.

Maheu said in earlier depositions that he gave the money, in an attache case, to Humphrey in a limousine parked outside the Century Plaza Hotel here in 1968. Humphrey, now a Democratic senator from Minnesota, was then Vice President and the Democratic presidential candidate, running against Richard M. Nixon.

Humphrey has denied ever receiving the money.
