

Nixon Still

Plans Full

A White House spokesman said yesterday that President Nixon still plans to produce full reports on Administration handling of the ITT affair, dairy industry contributions and other controversial matters before Congress begins its month-long recess.

But the spokesman, deputy press secretary Gerald L. Warren, said he could not promise that the goal to produce the so-called "White Papers" would be reached before Congress starts a month-long vacation, probably the end of this week.

"People are at work," Warren said. "It's our hope and goal to provide Congress with complete information . . . prior to adjournment. We're trying to meet that goal."
