

Suffers From Watergate

BOSTON, Dec. 17 (AP)—One out of every four persons polled in a survey conducted by The Boston Globe said he would be less likely to vote for Republican candidates because of the Watergate scandal.

However, nearly three-fourths of the 999 persons interviewed by telephone indicated that Watergate would not make any difference in how they vote next year, the newspaper said in a copyrighted article yesterday.

Forty-four per cent of those polled felt voters should sweep just about all elected leaders out of office because they tend to become corrupt and dishonest after being in office over a period of time.

The poll was conducted for the Globe by the Decision Research Corporation of Wellesley from Nov. 25 to 30.
