The Carnation Milk Co. yesterday became the ninth corporation to plead guilty to allegations brought by the Watergate special prosecutor that it illegally gave company funds to political fund-raisers.

H. Everett Olson, chairman of the company, pleaded guilty for himself and for Carnation. U.S. District Judge George L. Hart fined the company the maximum \$5000 and Olson the maximum of \$1000.

The contributions totaled \$8900. Of the total, \$2900 went to the Finance Committee for the Reelection of the President, \$1000 to the Senate-House majority dinner, an annual Washington affair sponsored by the House and the Senate Republican Campaign Committees, and \$5000 to the Southern California Presidential Dinner Committee.
