Television actor Carroll O'Connor. star of the popular "All in the Family" program, denied yesterday he wrote an article that appeared under his name in the Texas AFL-CIO Labor News and called for the im-

peachment of President Nix-

O'Connor. an AFL-CIO member, called the story "a complete fabrication" and wired the following message to the editor of the monthly news magazine:

"Your story purporting to

be a message from me urging the impeachment of the President is a complete fabrication." the wire read. "I regret that I must take legal action against a news organ of the AFL-CIO, my own union. But my attorney is proceeding immediately. No reporter capable of knowing-

ly writing an utter falsehood in his publication should be allowed to continue in its employ. I demand for the good of the union and for the integrity of its publications that the reporter responsible for this story be dismissed."

O'Connor, who portrays the caustically conservative

Archie Bunker in the television series, said he never has spoken publicly concerning the President.

"If anything, I tend not to favor impeachment," he added.

The story in question ran in the Texas AFL-CIO Labor

News' December issue under the headline, "Listen, Dingbats." The story carried O'Connor's name with the name "Archie Bunker" beneath it. The story was accompanied by a photograph of O'Connor.

Fred Cervelli, editor of the

Texas AFL-CIO Labor Newsheadquartered in Austin, Tex., said he took the story from the December issue of the Iowa AFL-CIO Labor News which carried the story with a picture but without O'Connor's byline.
