

Nixon Appoints His Wife Chairman of Volunteer Unit

SAN CLEMENTE, Calif., Dec. 31 (UPI)—President Nixon appointed Mrs. Nixon Monday to temporary chairman of a voluntary service advisory council, and named 24 persons to serve with her.

The council was created last October to help advise the director of Action, the Federal agency responsible for administration of the Peace Corps and other volunteer agencies.

The teamster president, Frank E. Fitzsimmons; W. Clement Stone, one of Mr. Nixon's biggest financial supporters in 1968 and 1972; Charles L. Bartlett, a columnist, and Jerome H. Holland, a member of the board of directors of the New York Stock Exchange, also were appointed.
