Yeoman Charls E. e Radford denied repeatedly ysterday that he was the source of leaks from National Security Council files in 1971.

Radford, 30, is a carer specialist in stenography and office procedures who was on the staff of two admirals who were theNavy's lisison offices to the National Security council.

He worked for rear Admiral Rembrandt C. Robinson and then for Rear Admiral Robert O. Welander, who succeeded to the lisison post when Robinson was killed in a plane crash.

Radford, said he had been accused of having leaked papers to Anderson, but that he maintained then and now that he was not guilty. He also denied that he knew of any security leaks to the office of Admiral Thomas H. Moorer, chairman of the Joint Chiefsof Staff.
