2d Watergate Figure Freed

The U.S. Court of Appeals here yesterday ordered that Frank A. Sturgis, one of the original Watergate defend-ants, be freed pending his ap-peal to withdraw his guilty plea in that case. The U.S. Parole Board al-ready had ordered that Stur-gis be freed March 7 in con-nection with his sentence in the Watergate case, but Stur-gis' attorney pointed out that after that time his client faces yet another sentence in an un-related case. He was sen-tenced to nine months on a federal auto theft charge in Florida last month. Attorney Daniel Schultz said one of the other Miami Watergate defendants, Virgilio Gonzales, has decided to wait until his March 7 parole date to be released rather than go ther Miami defendant, Euge-nio Martinez, has not decided which he would like to do, Schultz said. The fourth Miami Water-gate d ef en d an t, Bernard Barker, has already been freed pending his appeal. He is not yet eligible for parole in the Watergate case, sin c e he received a longer sentence than the other three men.
