Even Split on Nixon Quitting

As President Nixon begins his sixth and most critical year in office, the public is evenly divided on whether he should resign from office, with 46 per cent in favor and 46 per cent opposed. Only 8 per cent are undecided on the issue.

At the same time, however, a majority of Americans oppose removing the President from office through the process of impeachment. The latest findings, based on a survey completed prior to recent testimony concerning erasures of a key White House tape, show 53 per cent opposed to impeaching Mr. Nixon and compelling him to leave the presidency. This campares to 37 per cent who would favor such a course of action. One person in ten is undecided.

Some favor resignation but oppose impeachment because they believe the latter course of action would be detrimental to the best interests of the nation and would further sully our image abroad.

Groups most in favor of Mr. Nixon's resigning or being compelled to leave office through impeachment are non-whites, young adults and persons living in the east.

Opinion on these issues has a strongly partisan flavor politically, with the overwhelming majority of Republicans opposed to either course of action, but with Democrats leaning heavily in favor of both resignation and impeachment. The opinions of indpendents are about midway between those of Republicans and Democrats and very close to the views of the nation as a whole.
