Schlesinger Is Satisfied

With Role of Moorer

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (UPI)—A Pentagon spokesman said today that Defense Secretary James R. Schlesinger was satisfied "at this time" that Adm. Thomas H. Moorer had nothing to do with any military spying scheme on the National Security Council.

Jerry W. Friedheim, the defense spokesman, said that Mr. Schlesinger "has seen no indication at this time that the admiral's involvement was anything other than as the admiral described it."

Admiral Moorer, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, has described as ludicrous suggestions that he had any role in getting documents or information on secret policy discussions at the White House while Henry A. Kissinger was head of the Security Council.
