

Nixon Names Silbert

President Nixon announced yesterday he is nominating Earl J. Silbert, the original Watergate prosecutor for a four-year term as U.S. attorney for the District of Columbia.

Silbert, 37, handled all Watergate-related prosecutions and grand juries from 1972 until the appointment last year of the since-ousted special prosecutor Archibald Cox. He has been principal assistant U.S. attorney in the nation's capital since January, 1972.
