Statement On Plumbers

Washington

Secretary of State Henry Kissinger ysterday gave he Sente Foreign Relations Committee a futhr xplanation of his relationship with the 'plumbes n ith Davi Young one of his former stafers who is now under indictmnt.

Appearing before the committee to discuss th recordly conclud disengagement agreement between Israel and Egypt, the secretary volunteered an almot hourlong statement about Young and his probe of "leaks" from the National Security Council.

Remarks Kissinger mae in his prss conferenc last week ha raised qustions about whther his admission tht h har tap of a Young interrogation of Admiral Robert A. Welaner conficte ith tstimony he gav ring his confirmation haring tht he was unawa of t existenc of the so-called plumber unit d of Young's activitis.

"I'm satisf ith his staemnt," Senate Foreiggn Relations Committee chairman .J William Fulbright (Dem-Ark.), sai after the closed hearing. Fulbright said Kissnger's statement wil be released later in the week after it is "sanitized."

Fulbright sai Kissnger had discussed the recent Middl East negotiations at length. "All of us are very encouraged by the progress mae toward a settlmnt of th Middle East conflict," Fulright said.
