

Stennis Committee To Weigh Hearings

The Senate Armed Services Committee will meet in closed session today to consider whether to hold hearings on alleged military snooping in 1971 on the activities of Dr. Henry A. Kissinger and his National Security Council operations.

Committee Chairman John C. Stennis thus far has met informally with Adm. Thomas H. Moorer, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, on the matter. Pentagon sources say they expect the Senate committee will hold formal hearings.

The committee agenda today also involves future use of the Navy's petroleum reserves and there is some indication that the discussion may lead to renewed committee interest in the still-active oil holdings of Deputy Secretary of Defense William P. Clements.
