### **May Be Frozen**

NEW YORK, Jan. 31 (UPI)—A court-appointed receiver for fugitive financier Robert L. Vesco flew to London today to seek an injunction that would freeze an estimated \$40 million in Vesco assets in England.

U.S. District Court Judge Charles E. Stewart Jr. signed a formal authorization Wednesday for John K. Schemmer to seek the injunction from England's High Court of Justice.

Schemmer was named a receiver in the Securities and Exchange Commission suit alleging that Vesco and others looted \$224 million from four mutual funds he controlled when he was board chairman of International Controls Corp. of Fairfield, N.J.

Vesco was cited as a co-defendant with former Cabinet officers John N. Mitchell and Maurice H. Stans in an indictment filed last May. They are accused of attempting to influence the SEC investigation in exchange for Vesco's secret cash contribution of \$200,000 to President Nixon's re-election campaign in 1972.

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
