Nixon in Church-- Protests Praised

Washington

Accompanied by members of his family and Mamie Eisenhower, President Nixon attended church yesterday and heard the minister praise the moral courage of those who had protested the Vietnam war.

The services were held in the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church, three blocks from the White House and where former President Eisenhower regularly worshipped.

In a sermon on moral courage, the minister, the Rev. George M. Docherty, cited both war protesters and the former president, who as commander of allied forces in Europe during World War II launched the Normany invasion, as persons who possessed the mor-

al courage to pursue worthy goals without fear of failure.

The President and his wife, Pat, were joined by their daughter and son-in-law, Julie and David Eisenhower, Mamie Eisenhower, who is a weekend White House guest, and several friends of the young Eisenhowers.

White House spokesman Gerald L. Warren said Mrs. Eisenhower came from her Gettysburg, Pa. farm Saturday and joined President and Mrs. Nixon Saturday evening for dinner at David and Julie's home in suburban Maryland.

Snow covered the sidewalks and temperatures were below freezing as the group traveled the three blocks in White House limousines.
